

As you will see in this newsletter, much work has continued to progress in Timor-Leste, Indonesia and in the Pacific.

However, we are believing that our missionaries Br & Sis Perry will be able to go into the field at some point in 2021 but we also want to appeal to the Australian Church for more missionaries to put up their hand for short and long term missions endeavours.

We are calling upon someone, perhaps the next generation of missionaries, to let us know that they are willing to go and do something for the cause of Christ.

Overseas Missions- reaching out from home!

Br and Sis Perry

Greetings once again in the precious name of our Lord and Saviour, Jesus Christ!

I have been asked to convey what this year has been like for Diane and I. While it was not as anticipated for us, we can nevertheless testify that the Lord has again done exceedingly abundantly...

As background, 2020 was always to be a transitional year for us as well as the Timor-Leste mission. We would base ourselves in Australia while undertaking up to six, monthlong return visits to Timor-Leste, and sometimes Indonesia, for strategic purposes. In accord with this, during January and February Diane and I undertook one mission each to Timor-Leste for pre-planned activity, including the continuation of the Baucau building program.

However, while I was on my second mission in March the Australian government directed that Australian citizens who reside in Australia, but who were overseas at the time, return as soon as possible. I had just facilitated the first in a series of Fundamental Doctrine teaching workshops for ministers and leaders in Bali. Such workshops form part of my missionary duties presently through a Pacific Regional initiative called the 'Indonesia Cooperative', so I praised God that at least the initial workshop in Bali was able to be undertaken before my return to Australia for 2 weeks of required self-quarantine.

Following the imposition of international travel restrictions, both Diane and I became busy from Australia in liaison and consultation with senior Timor-Leste church representatives. Diane continued to administer related activities funded by or through Australian Overseas Missions, while I attempted to continue contributions to Tetun translation and transcription priorities and efforts. As a bi-vocational minister also, while unable to undertake overseas mission travel, I have taken the opportunity to renew my residency of clinical nursing practice in Australia. All in all, Diane and I praise God for His goodness, wisdom and direction as we have together with Br. Harvey and the Overseas Missions Board navigated 2020!

Special initiatives, works & construction milestone in 2020:

Very significantly to report is the incredible work that has been undertaken by the Timor-Leste church and ministry during this challenging year, such as regular executive consultation on important organisational matters, the senior leadership team continuing to strive to prepare the church for growth, and related national initiatives including two significant teaching events at which Dili ministers taught and preached. I wish to highly commend these and other initiatives of our wonderful counterparts in Timor-Leste who I love and respect greatly.

I also wish to take this opportunity to acknowledge Sis Elizabeth Baptista, who in Dili has worked hard this year on transcription of bible lessons into the Tetun language, as well as leading a team of translation editors. We believe, Sis Elizabeth, that the LORD has raised you up for such a time as this, and we thank you and all the team.

Finally, may I acknowledge a special milestone for 2020, which is the completion of the education facility in Baucau.

This was quite a feat during the pandemic and, as well as thanking the ministry teams of both Dili and Baucau for stepping up in required administration and other ways in relation to this construction, I wish to sincerely thank all the churches and individuals who continue to faithfully pray and give to such projects through the UPCA Overseas Missions Department.

I pray the above has given a sense at least of what has been an extraordinary year for us all in 2020.

While WE are presently limited in our movements, OUR GOD absolutely isn't.


